
Te Tai Poutini **West Coast**

1 Denniston Mine

Off State Highway 67, 18km northeast of Westport

Coaling in the clouds

Once a leading coal mining town, Denniston sits high on the edge of a steep incline railway once described as the 8th wonder of the world. A town of extremes, workers mined the highest quality coal but families suffered the lowest living conditions. Explore the remnants of the town and mine on foot, mountain bike or 4WD and take in magnificent coastal views.

Hokitika Port, Commercial and Government Centre

State Highway 6, Hokitika

Treasure seekers' town

The most valued port of the gold rush era and now the gateway to the West Coast, Hokitika draws discoverers. Wander the wide streets of the pounamu and goldfields capital, its numerous artisan stores, restored sites, and driftwood and sunset-famous beach, and take home a taonga of vour own.

Historic Reefton

State Highways 69 and 7, Reefton

Gold. Lights. Action.

Nicknamed Quartzopolis and the Town of Light, Reefton was the booming commercial centre of quartz reef gold mining and the first place in the southern hemisphere to supply electric lighting. Feel like you're in a movie as you tour the character town, then get in on some action with its mountain biking and walking trails.

Off State Highway 7, 21km south of Reefton

Explore this once thriving gold town and picture

Shinbone Alley. Visit for a day and take in the

Ōkārito Off State Highway 6, 15km north of Franz Josef township

A golden oasis

A hub of conservation, Ōkārito is home to the ancient Ōkārito lagoon, Te Tai Poutini West Coast's oldest known building and over 70 species of birds including the rare kotuku. Explore the lagoon via kayak or step inside historic buildings, including the iconic Donovan's Store, to learn about a town of goldrush and taonga.

Te Kopikopiko o te Waka

Cook Flat Road, 9km off State Highway 6 near Fox Glacier township

Where Te Wai Pounamu began

With panoramic views of Kā Tiritiri o te Moana/ The Southern Alps and a great vantage for Te Weheka/Fox Glacier, Te Kopikopiko o te Waka tells the Te Ao Māori story of how Te Wai Pounamu/ the South Island came to be. Co-designed with mana whenua from Ngāti Māhaki, this site uses sculpture to tell the celestial story of Aoraki, making it an immersive and interactive experience for all visitors.
